

Teaching Term Position in Business

The School of Arts and Social Science at Grenfell Campus, Memorial University invites applications for an eight-month teaching term position in their Bachelor of Business Administration program at the rank of Teaching Assistant Professor or Lecturer, depending on the qualifications. The position will begin on September 1, 2020 and end on April 30, 2021.

The successful candidate will be expected to cover a regular teaching load (three courses per semester) in support of the Bachelor of Business Administration and the Business Minor programs. The successful candidate will be responsible to teach courses in organizational behavior, business leadership, and human resource management. The minimal qualification for this position is the completion of an MBA, however preference will be given to applicants with a PhD or DBA. The preferred candidate will have post-secondary teaching experience, ideally with remote and/or online experience.
